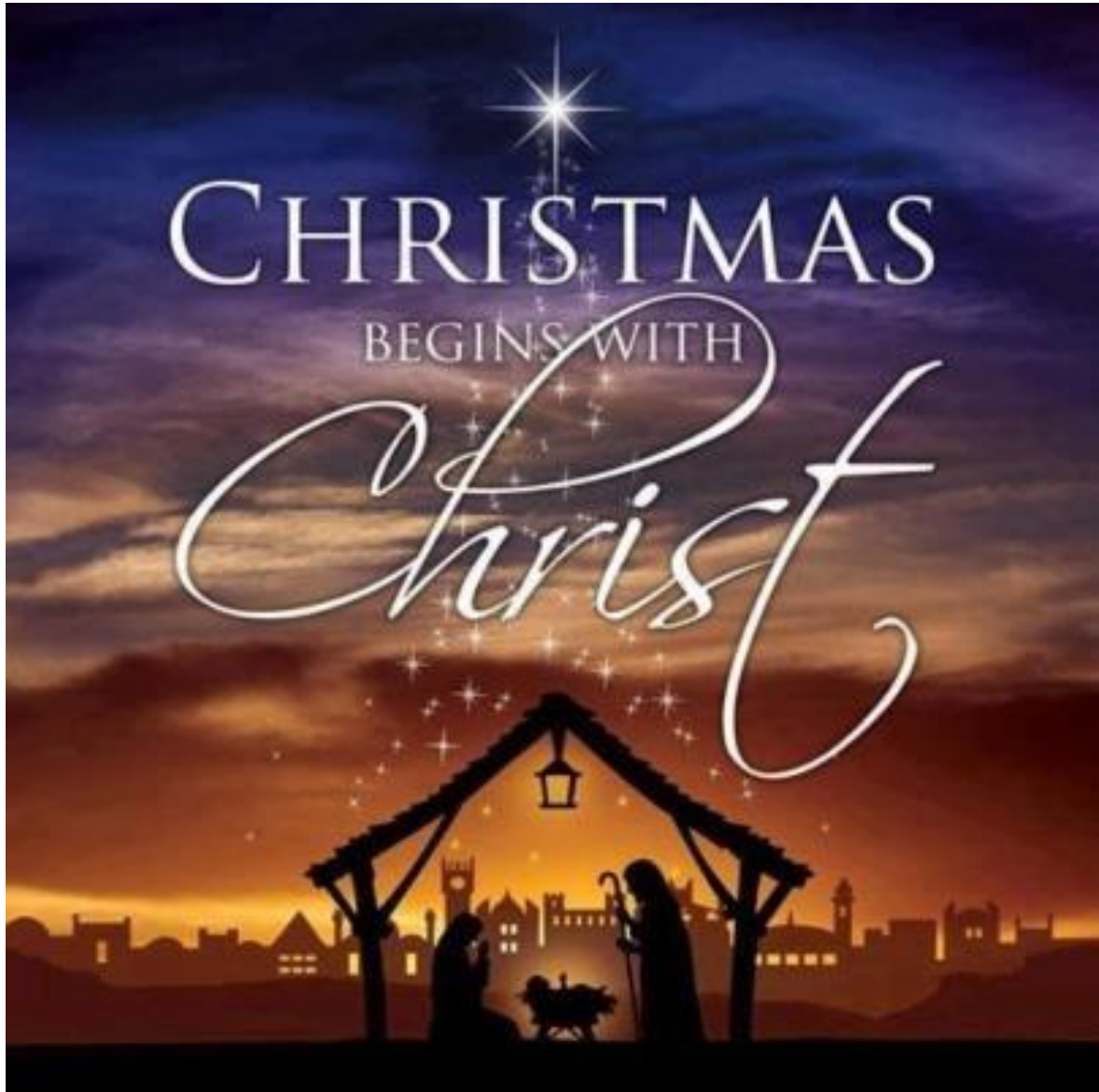

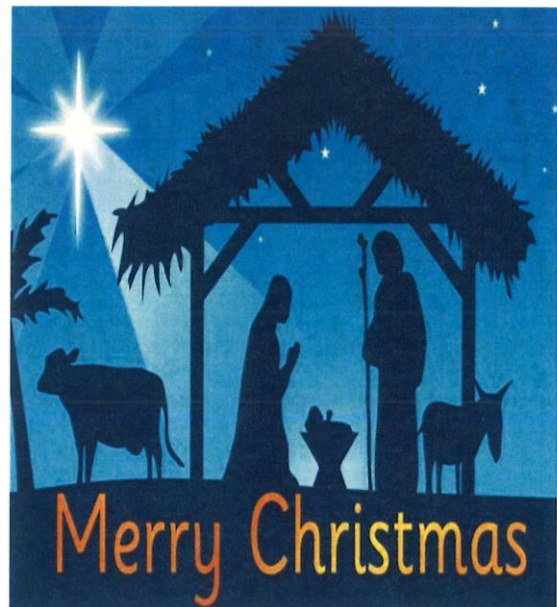
Christmas Prayer

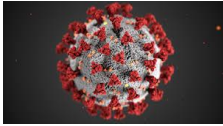

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Update

Some restrictions were lifted in NSW on 8 November for those who are fully vaccinated. This had been brought forward from 1 December, due to the high vaccination rates across NSW. Further restrictions will ease when NSW reaches 95% double vaccination or on 15 December 2021, whichever comes first.

While it is great news that we are now able to enjoy more freedoms that we previously could not, we are seeing the number of COVID-19 positive cases rise rapidly in our local area. This is why we all should continue to check in using QR codes and manual methods, as it is very important in minimising and tracking the spread of the virus.

There are several ways you can keep up to date with whether you have been a casual or a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. The Services NSW COVID app provides case alerts in your check-in history in case you have visited a venue on the same day as a confirmed case of COVID-19. You can check the NSW Government exposure sites list for venues of concern. You may be contacted directly by a NSW Health contact tracer if you are deemed to be a close contact.

NSW Health has developed a fact sheet regarding required testing and isolation periods. This fact sheet contains information specific to those who are fully vaccinated and those who are not. The fact sheet can be found on the NSW Health website where you can download a copy.

Please still continue to wear masks, use QR code check-ins and show proof of vaccination where required. Also be sure to follow COVID-19 safe practices including washing hands, monitoring symptoms and social distancing as well as follow the self-isolation and testing requirements if you are a close contact of someone with COVID-19. Even with these restrictions lifted, the Parish services are still subject to Public Health Orders. Please check with these services before visiting.

The NSW Government has updated the roadmap for easing restrictions after the State reaches the 95% double dose vaccination target, or 15 December, whichever comes first. Adjustments to previous settings scheduled for this milestone include:

- Masks will only be required on public transport and planes, at airports, and for indoors front-of-house hospitality staff who are not fully vaccinated (previously all indoors front-of-house hospitality staff regardless of vaccination status). Masks will be strongly encouraged in settings where you cannot social distance.
- No density limits (previously one person per 2 square metres).
- COVID-19 safety plans will be optional for businesses and will be supported by SafeWork NSW.

- QR check-ins will only be required at high-risk venues including hospitals, aged and disability care facilities, gyms, places of worship, funerals or memorial services, personal services (e.g. hairdressers and beauty salons), limited hospitality settings (including pubs, small bars, registered clubs and nightclubs), and for indoor music festivals with more than 1000 people.
- Proof of vaccination will no longer be required by Public Health Order for most activities (businesses can still require proof at their own discretion). Proof of vaccination will still be required for indoor music festivals with more than 1000 people.

The roadmap may be fine-tuned as NSW Health monitors the COVID-19 situation over the coming weeks. Local Government areas may be subject to different rules and restrictions in line with Public Health Orders.

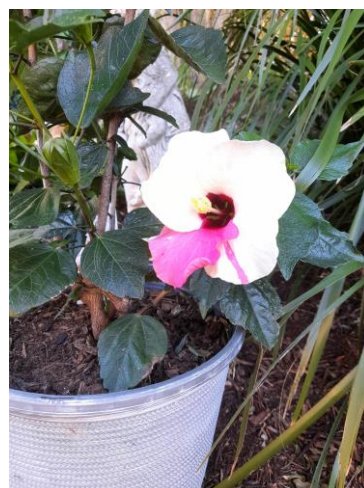
International arrivals from 28 November 2021 – A new COVID-19 variant of concern has emerged internationally, the Omicron variant. From 12am on 28 November, all fully vaccinated travellers arriving in NSW who have been in any overseas country must get a COVID-19 PCR (nose and throat) test and self-isolate at their accommodation or place of residence for at least 72 hours. All travellers arriving in NSW who have been in South Africa, Lesotho, Botswana, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Namibia, Eswatini, Malawi, and Seychelles in the 14-day period before their arrival will be required to enter hotel quarantine for 14 days, irrespective of their vaccination status. Anyone who has already arrived in NSW and has been in these countries within the past 14 days must immediately get a COVID-19 PCR (nose and throat swab) test and self-isolate for 14 days. They must contact NSW Health on 1800 943 553. Vaccinated travellers can transit beyond Sydney to another NSW region or state to self-isolate and test. Follow the rules for people who are fully vaccinated. All unvaccinated travellers from any overseas country will continue to enter hotel quarantine and must follow the rules for people who are not fully vaccinated arriving in NSW from overseas.

NSW GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS

The Port Macquarie-Hastings Council will be holding elections for Mayor and councillors on **Saturday 4th December 2021, 8:00am – 6:00pm**. Voting is compulsory at NSW Local Government elections. Pre-polling can be undertaken between Monday 22 November and Friday 3 December 2021. Opening Hours: Mon-Sat, 9:00am-5:00pm.

- Port Macquarie Public School, Grant Street. (Assisted access, no designated accessible parking spot, no accessible toilet, path of travel from car park may be difficult.)
- Hastings Secondary College Westport Campus, Findlay Avenue. (Assisted access, no designated accessible parking spot.)
- 1st Port Macquarie Sea Scout Hall, 9 Buller Street. (Assisted access, no designated accessible parking spot, no accessible toilet.)
- Hastings Public School, 85 Yarranabee Road. (Assisted access, access ramp does not meet standards, no designated accessible parking spot, no accessible toilet, path of travel from car park may be difficult.)

**PLEASE DO NOT
FEED THE BIRDS**



Residents are reminded to not feed wild birds, including crows. This creates many unseen problems such as malnutrition and disease. They are also likely to become pests. Feeding native birds in our garden can spread disease through a concentration of food and birds in large numbers in one place.

Feeding encourages birds to become dependent on humans for their survival. The Village has an abundance of native shrubs for wild birds to feed.



Companion Animal Owner

There are many residents in the Villages who are a Companion Animal owner. For those of you who are, you have responsibilities towards the wider community as well as towards your pet.

You are responsible for ensuring that your animal does not harm or threaten any other person or animal. For dog owners, this means that you must be able to contain your dog on your property, and when you are in public with your dog, you must keep it on a leash.

Dog owners are also required to promptly dispose of any faeces which their dog may leave anywhere, other than your own property.

If you own a cat, you are encouraged to keep them inside to reduce the chances of them fighting and hunting other animals.

REQUEST FOR ADDITIONS IN VILLAS

Any additions, which includes screen doors, air conditioning units, ceiling fans, grab rails, patios etc, must be approved prior to work being undertaken. Please provide a written request to the Village Manager. A written response will then be provided to you.

FREE LEDs Unlimited LED replacements, fully installed for just \$33 flyer.

*Previously, residents may have received a flyer in your letterbox regarding the free replacement of LEDs for a one off \$33 Electrician fee. It has come to our attention, that further flyers advertising this offer, are being distributed in the village. The April 2021 and July 2021 Village Newsletters advised residents they could not take advantage of this offer. St Agnes' Property Services have made repeated calls to this company requesting provision of contractor insurances and licences, which has resulted in no response. **PLEASE DISREGARD THESE FLYERS.***

VILLAGE TRANSPORT SERVICES

Residents are reminded that the *Village Transport Service* is available on **Monday and Friday mornings from 9:30am until 1:00pm**. The transport vehicle is driven by volunteers from St Agnes' Catholic Parish. At least 24 hours' notice must be given to book the transport vehicle and bookings can be made via the Village Office on 6584 3515. Please ensure you have the name of the place that you would like to be transported to when you book the transport vehicle. Many residents call and are not sure what the name of the place is or address, and we need to include the name and address on each transport booking. This service is also available to residents who drive.

Our village transport program is still planned to expand further days during the week, however we need more volunteers for this to occur. Green Waste

At the recent Stage Meetings, residents were advised that St Agnes' Property Services will be investigating a better Green Waste Collection system in the Villages. Residents will be consulted throughout this process.

The current process will continue until we implement the new green waste system, whereby the green waste is collected weekly (EACH MONDAY, WEDNESDAY & FRIDAY) by the Village Gardener. Please place your green waste on your front lawn for collection. Residents should have a separate bin/container for your green waste. The green waste bin is specifically for organic matter such as garden waste (weeds, clippings) and food waste items. Food scraps are to be wrapped in newspaper or dropped straight into the cornstarch bag. Any meat, bones, seafood and prawn shells are to be frozen and then wrapped in newspaper or cornstarch bags and placed in the green waste bin the night prior to collection day. Soiled kitchen towel, serviettes, paper and newspaper can also be placed into the green waste bin.

A kitchen food waste bin and compostable cornstarch bags are available to purchase from J.R. Richards. Their office is located at 53 Jindalee Road, Port Macquarie, phone 6580 3300. Their opening hours are Monday to Friday between 8:00am and 4:00pm. The correct cash or credit card payment is only accepted. Costs of these items are:

\$15.00 - compostable cornstarch bags (150 bags)

\$15.00 - kitchen food waste bin.

TOUCH TENNIS – by Lesley Ware, on behalf of West Port Macquarie Tennis Club

We would like to introduce you to West Port Macquarie Tennis Club's "Touch Tennis" game, suitable for folk of most ages, physical abilities, and requiring no tennis-playing experience. Ex-tennis players would certainly find the game fulfilling and a lot of fun.

Touch Tennis is played by two, three, or four people on quarter-sized courts with tennis racquets (which we can provide) and sponge balls slightly larger than a tennis ball. These balls move more slowly than a tennis ball and are light, not causing strain on the player's hand or arm when hitting the ball. There is very little movement required and the sport is marvelous for the elderly if they are slightly mobile and have reasonable balance. More mobile players can of course make the game as fast or active as they wish.

We currently have Touch Tennis players who:

1. Are no longer confident playing tennis on a full sized court but do not wish to move onto another activity such as bowls;
2. Have never played tennis; and/or
3. Are physically or cognitively disabled.

West Port Tennis would like to encourage village residents to come along to our complex in Woods Street (opposite Aldi) if they are interested in having a go. We have 4 Touch Tennis courts (thus can field 16 players at one time if necessary). A few hours of Touch Tennis usually costs about \$2 per person but we invite village residents to play free of charge the first time, to see if they would like to play again. If they are hesitant, they may like to come along to watch their friends while having a cup of tea.

Our current Touch Tennis groups play for a few hours twice a week and enjoy stopping for a chat and a cuppa under the shade of the cabanas (or when COVID restrictions permit, in the clubhouse). Residents are welcome to join them or form your own group.

It is said that 'Tennis players live longer!' and the fact that we have 23 players over the age of 80 still playing excellent tennis speaks for itself.

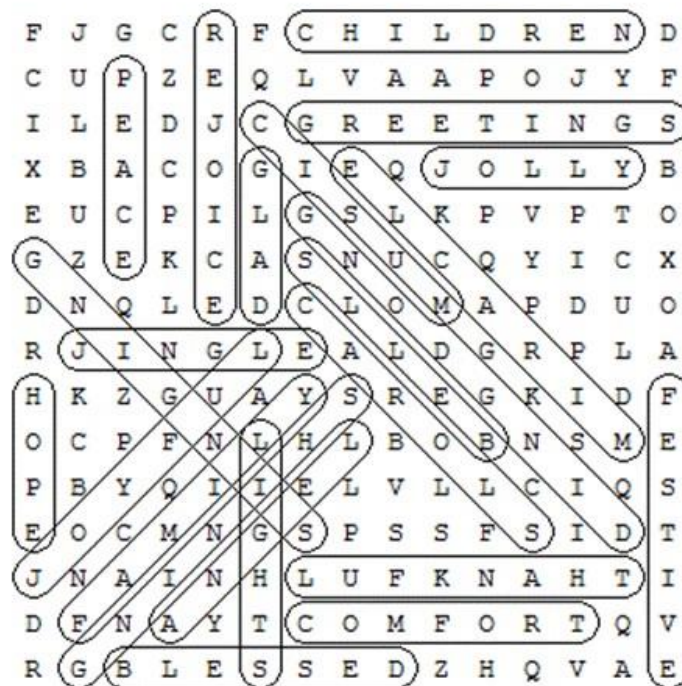
