Please note: The Village Office will be closed on Thursday, 25 April 2024 for Anzac Day Public Holiday.



Anzac Day, 25 April, is one of Australia's most important national occasions. It marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War.

When war broke out in 1914 Australia had been a federated nation for only 13 years, and its government was eager to establish a reputation among the nations of the world. When Britain declared war in August 1914 Australia was automatically placed on the side of the Commonwealth. In 1915 Australian and New Zealand soldiers formed part of the expedition that set out to capture the Gallipoli peninsula in order to open the Dardanelles to the allied navies. The ultimate objective was to capture Constantinople (now Istanbul), the capital of the Ottoman Empire, an ally of Germany.

Let us thank all our servicemen and servicewomen, past and present, who have displayed courage and self-sacrifice serving our country.



### **BIGGEST MORNING TEA – MAY 2024**



The St Agnes' Social Committee will be hosting the Biggest Morning Tea on **Wednesday 15 May 2024** to raise money for the Cancer Council.

We invite residents to donate items that can be made-up into packs. These packs will be raffled on the day. We would like residents to

donate any of the following individual items that can be used to make up packs such as:

- 2. Nibble pack nuts, pretzels, crackers, chips etc

All donations can be given to anyone on the Social Committee, or you can leave items at the Village office up to one week prior to the event (Wednesday 8 May 2024).



#### **VILLAGE RULES – NOISE**

Residents are reminded of the Village Rules in relation to noise. Clause 1 of the Rules and Conditions Relating to Occupation of Villas at St Agnes' Village states:

An occupier of a villa shall not create any noise likely to interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of the occupier of another villa or any person lawfully using common property.

There have been instances where car horns are being used unnecessarily in the village. Please be mindful that many residents have a rest during the day. It would be appreciated if residents and visitors do not use their car horn whilst driving in the village. Village Management would be very appreciative of courtesy shown in this regard.

In NSW, the law on using horns and similar warning devices is outlined in Rule 224 Road Rules 2014 (NSW). <u>Resident Lock Out procedure</u> – if residents cannot recall the security PIN for their locked key box, the following procedure should be followed:

- During business hours, 8:00am to 4:30pm Monday to Friday, please phone the Village Office on telephone 6584 3515 and a staff member will assist.
- After hours, 4:30pm to 8:00am, Monday to Friday and weekends and public holidays, please phone our Nurse Call System Provider, INS LifeGuard (1800 636 226) who will be able to provide you with the PIN number. Please be aware for security purposes, INS LifeGuard will ask you to verify your name, villa number and date of birth, prior to providing the PIN.
- If residents are unsure of how to access the locked box using the PIN, you can ask for assistance from your neighbour.



**Don't forget to test your INS LifeGuard Personal Alarm System and SmartTracker this month**. Also ensure your INS LifeGuard IP Dialler remains on, even when you are away on holiday. Please notify the Village Office or INS LifeGuard if you will be away.



#### **INS LifeGuard SmartTracker hint.**

There is a button on the side of the LifeGuard SmartTracker with a telephone symbol on it. This button is able to turn the device on and off. As the button is level with the side of the device, it is easy to turn the device off without knowing.



One of the first indicators is that there is no green and blue flashing lights (flashing means they are connecting to Telstra and the GPS). If the device looks like it is not charging, press the telephone symbol at the side to see if the lights start flashing and it may also vibrate. If this does not happen, or you believe there is an issue with your SmartTracker, please phone the Village Office on 6584 3515 and we will arrange for this to be sent to INS Lifeguard for repair or replacement.

**PLEASE NOTE:** For optimal function, please ensure that the SmartTracker and IP Dialler (Nurse call machine) are plugged directly into a power point, not a power board.

**PEST/VERMIN CONTROL** - Residents are reminded that it is their responsibility to eradicate pest/vermin control in their villa (internally and externally), unless it has been assessed as an infestation. An infestation is to be reported to the Repairs and Maintenance number 1300 522 511 for determination by Property Services.

#### **Gentle Exercise Class**

A free Gentle Exercise class is held every Tuesday morning in the Tenison Woods Centre between 11am and 11:45am. Seated and standing exercise videos for seniors, working all aspects of fitness. Come along and improve your strength fitness, balance and coordination, decrease pain and begin moving well. Further information can be obtained by contacting the Village Office on 6584 3515.

#### **REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE**

For all general maintenance requests (including maintenance to common areas) and after hours' emergency maintenance requests, Village residents MUST call the hotline on <u>1300 522 511</u> or email the details to: <u>maintenance@stagnesparish.org.au</u> (24 hours a day 7 days a week).

It is important that this is adhered to as the jobs will be logged through ISS and then given to maintenance staff. **PLEASE DO NOT RING MAINTANENCE STAFF DIRECTLY ON THEIR MOBILE PHONE.** 

When calling after hours or on a weekend, please stay on the phone to listen to the procedure. DO NOT HANG UP! If life or structure is in danger, call triple zero (000).

#### **REQUEST FOR ADDITIONS IN VILLAS**

Any additions, which includes screen doors, air conditioning units, ceiling fans, patios etc, must be approved by Village Management prior to work being undertaken. Please provide a written request to the Village Manager. A written response will then be provided to you.

#### WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

Residents are encouraged to report any odour from the Wastewater Treatment Plant on Ocean Drive Port Macquarie. Please report to the Environment Protection Authority (EPA) hotline on telephone 131 555, and to the Port Macquarie Hastings Council by phoning 6581 8111 during business hours or phoning 6583 2225 after hours. Reporting any odours will enable the EPA and Port Macquarie Hastings Council to work together to address these concerns.

#### **Village Transport Service**

Residents are reminded that the *Village Transport Service* is available to all village residents for transport to medical appointments, shopping, visiting friends, village functions/activities, even if you wish to go to the beach for a walk or into town for coffee – whatever transport requirements residents would like during the operating hours of the service. The transport vehicle is driven by volunteers from St Agnes' Catholic Parish. At least 24 hours' notice must be given to book the transport vehicle or to cancel bookings. Bookings can be made by phoning the Village Office on 6584 3515.

I would love to increase the *Village Transport Service* to 5 half days per week. Currently the *Village Transport Service* operates three half mornings and one afternoon. I encourage village residents to utilise the *Village Transport Service* for this service to continue into the future.
